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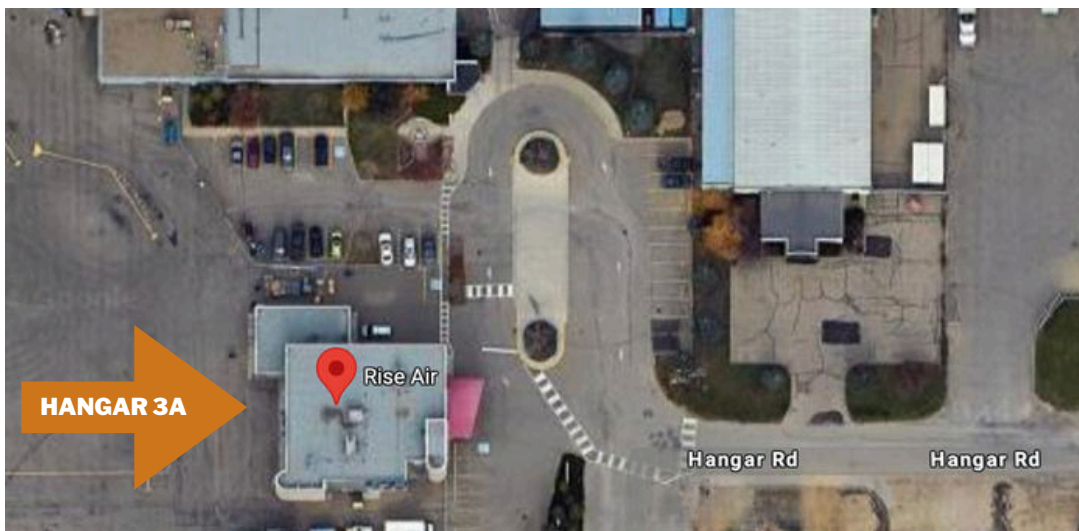
ARRIVAL & DEPARTURE

DEPARTURE TO THE LODGE VIA SASKATOON

Now that you have your trip date booked, it's time to book your return commercial flight from home to Saskatoon, SK (Airport code YXE). Please ensure you arrive in Saskatoon the day before you are scheduled to arrive at the lodge. Our charters from Saskatoon depart at 6:30 a.m. from the Rise Air Hangar at the airport.

You should arrive at the hangar the morning of your trip no later than 5:45 a.m. The departure will be at Hangar 3A. Upon return to Saskatoon you will be dropped off at the main airport terminal for your convenience. When you enter Hangar 3A, you will check in with the CSR at the desk - there will be a monitor displaying "Arctic Lodges" so you know exactly where to check in.

The address for the hangar is 3A Hangar Road, Saskatoon.



Rise Air offers free parking for those driving to Saskatoon. Each vehicle is required to have a display pass - this can be obtained when checking in at the CSR desk.

CHARTER TO THE LODGE

There is a weight restriction of 30 lbs per guest for checked baggage and 13 lbs for carry-on on all charters. This allowance can be combined to 43lbs total if all luggage is checked. Due to this restriction, we cannot accept coolers, large quantities of alcohol, etc.

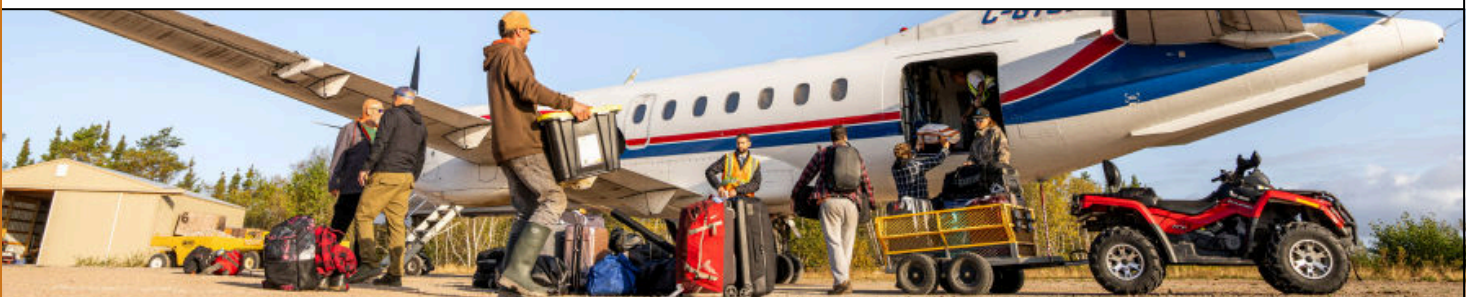
On your final day you will arrive back in Saskatoon at approximately 11:10 a.m. We recommend to not book any flights home until 1:00 p.m. or later that day.

IMPORTANT – We cannot be responsible for missed or cancelled commercial flights and cannot hold charters. Please ensure that you have purchased travel interruption/cancellation insurance on your entire fishing package should there be any unforeseen delays. We recommend obtaining an insurance policy from World Nomads (Explorers Plan). Alternatively, please contact your local insurance provider for travel insurance options.

GUESTS ARRIVING BY PRIVATE AIRCRAFT

If you are a US citizen flying to Arctic Lodges, you will need to report to the nearest Airport of Entry (AOE), in most cases this will be in Winnipeg, MB or Regina, SK. From there, a common place to fuel enroute to the Lodge is Flin Flon, Manitoba or La Ronge, Saskatchewan.

HOTELS IN SASKATOON

We have a rate agreement with three hotels less than 5 minutes from the airport. Please choose your hotel based on your personal preference. We recommend booking your hotel room early. Should there be a special event in the city, these hotels can sell out quickly.

THE HAMPTON INN & SUITES

The Hampton Inn & Suites by Hilton Saskatoon Airport is a new and modern hotel. One thing to consider is they do not have restaurants on site which can be an inconvenience for some. For dinner there are many options for dining only a 5 minute cab ride away. Please note there is also no breakfast service available before 6 a.m.

Here's what they include:

- Rate \$129/night CND + applicable taxes for standard rooms.
- Complimentary high-speed WI-FI access in all guest rooms and lobby.
- HHonors guests will have the option to earn both HHonors points & airline miles.
- Complimentary 24hr shuttle service or taxi to the airport (Please schedule your shuttle time with the front desk to depart to the Rise Air hangar upon check in for 5:30 a.m.).

THE SANDMAN HOTEL SASKATOON AIRPORT

The Sandman Hotel Saskatoon Airport is slightly dated but does have 2 food and beverage restaurants on site which many of our guests appreciate.

- Rate \$102/night CDN + applicable taxes for a standard room with 2 queen beds.
 - 24 hour Denny's and Shark Club Sports Bar/Grill onsite.
- Complimentary wireless internet access in all guest rooms and lobby.
 - Complimentary access to their fitness centre, pool and hot tub.
- Complimentary 24hr shuttle service or taxi to the airport (Please schedule your shuttle time with the front desk to depart to the Rise Air hangar upon check in for 5:30 a.m.).

CUSTOMS

If you or anyone in your group is not a Canadian citizen, you will need a valid passport to enter Canada. Keep in mind, if you have ever been charged and convicted of a crime (including DUI), you are considered “in-admissible” into Canada. However, you may be able to be declared “admissible” to travel to Canada by contacting Citizenship and Immigration Canada – Canadian Visa Office. If you are traveling with a minor under 18 years of age and without the presence of either parent, you will need written permission from the parents indicating that you have the authority to take them into Canada. You must carry proper identification for the child such as a passport. Divorced or separated parents should carry custody or legal separation documents and/or letter of authorization to facilitate their entry into Canada. ALCOHOL AND TOBACCO

You are permitted duty-free up to 1.14 litres of liquor or 1.5 litres of wine and 200 cigarettes and up to 50 cigars (non Cuban). Arctic Lodges also has a bar and store with many options to choose from. If you are not planning on bringing your own liquor or need a certain type of mix on hand, please let us know. Simply indicate your drink of choice on our guest information form under “special instructions” and we will have it available for purchase in our bar. ARRIVAL AT THE LODGE

You will be greeted at our airstrip at approximately 8:30 a.m. and our staff will gather up the luggage to be boated over to the lodge. Although the boat ride is less than 10 minutes, we recommend having your rain suit handy should you need it. Once you arrive at the Lodge you can relax and have a coffee or beverage of choice. Brunch will be served before heading onto the lake and a brief orientation will be held. Our staff will show you to your cabin and you can get ready for your fishing day. Your Guide is prepared to start fishing as soon as you are ready and will greet you at the dock.

MEALS

Breakfast will be served in the main lodge starting at 7 a.m. The main lodge is open at 5:30 a.m. each morning for those early risers and the coffee will be flowing.

Our shore lunches are sure to be one of the highlights of your trip! Using our experience and expertise, we pack a lunch basket that 99% of our guests rave about. We recommend trying our standard shore lunch on the first day. All shore lunches will be prepared and served by your Guide. Should you require anything additional or would like something different on the following days, please give your order to our lodge staff (not your Guide) and we will let the kitchen know to have it ready for the next morning.

Dinner is a 3-course meal served in the main lodge starting at 6:30 p.m. You will receive a menu each morning to select your dinner options.

Should you have any special dietary restrictions or allergies, please indicate on your guest information form before your trip. Also please let us know what you'd prefer to drink so we can make sure to have it on hand!

GENERAL INFORMATION

FOREST FIRES

Forest fires are most often started by carelessness. Our Guides take special care to ensure shore lunch fires are located on sandy beaches or rocky shores. Do not start a fire on top of moss or near any other vegetation. When you leave, please make sure that the fire is completely out, with the ashes well saturated with water. Please remember to bring all trash back with you to the Lodge.

GET YOUR FISHING LICENSE - AFTER APRIL 1ST

All guests are responsible for purchasing their fishing license online or via telephone prior to your arrival. ****PLEASE WAIT UNTIL APRIL TO PURCHASE YOUR LICENCE AS THE PREVIOUS YEARS LICENCES ARE SOLD UNTIL MARCH****

- Select “Sign in” or “Create my Web Account”
- Select if you are an existing user or if you need to create a new record
- Enter all of your information
- Once you are signed in, select “Purchase a License”
- For US residents, select the last option “Non-Resident” (of Canada)
- Under “Angling”, select “Annual Non-Resident Angling License”
- Select “Add to Cart”
- Proceed to “Checkout Shopping Cart” and once approved, print your license.

Alternatively, licenses can also be purchased by calling **1-855-848-4773**, however there may be an associated convenience fee.

It is essential that you carry your signed fishing license with you at all times out on the lake as conservations officers do random checks.

FISHING GUIDES & STAFF

We are very proud of our amazing team of professional guides and service staff at Arctic Lodges. As a friendly reminder please do not share liquor or beer with our staff or gift as a tip. We have strict rules with alcohol in camp while employed with us and our staff are well aware of this. If you would like to have an evening beverage with your guide or a staff member please limit to two drinks and only if their off shift. Thank you in advance!

GRATUITIES

We are often asked what a sufficient tip is for the guides and service staff. This is a tough question and our answer is this: **the tip should reflect your satisfaction with our team.**

The average tip is 18-20 % of your package price, where this amount is split between your guide and the lodge staff. On average this equates to \$1000 per guest for the 4 day trip (\$500 for your guide, \$500 for the lodge staff). When you are leaving a tip for your Guide it's normal practice to tip on your last day. Cash on hand is highly recommended and in best interest for our employees.

We have 16+ lodge staff with many in the background working hard to make sure your stay is five star! **Once again cash is best for lodge tips.** There is a 4% processing fee for tips paid via credit card due to the high commission rate we pay for credit card processing.

GARMIN INREACH SE DEVICE

For communication and safety purposes your Guide will have an InReach SE device while you're out on the lake. The InReach SE is a two-way satellite communicator with GPS. It's a great tool to have if there is a need to contact the Lodge so we're able to locate you on the lake.

TACKLE & OUR SHOP

Our Lodge has a well equipped tackle shop as well as clothing and souvenirs available for purchase. Our preferred method of payment is with a personal check or cash however, we do accept Visa & Mastercard.

PACKING

ESSENTIALS CHECKLIST

- 2 – 3 pairs of **extra** socks
- Long underwear
- 2 pairs pants (optional: zip off legs for hotter days)
- 3 shirts: 1 short sleeve & 2 long sleeve
- 1 pull-over: fleece or wool - something very warm
- Slippers and bathing suits (for hot tubs!)
- Rain jacket, highly waterproof and breathable with hood **(highly suggested)**
- Rain pants, highly waterproof and breathable **(highly suggested)**
- 1 hat with brim & visor **(waterproof is a plus)**
- Sunglasses **(polarized)**
- 1 pair of running shoes or equivalent
- 1 pair of rubber/waterproof boots **(warm is suggested)**
- Neoprene gloves for colder days **(early June/late August)**
- Down vest for colder days **(early June/late August)**
- Lip Balm
- Sunscreen
- Bug spray
- Camera and/or GoPro **(We have amazing scenery and wildlife so it's always nice to bring home great pictures. You'll also want to have lots of pictures with your trophy fish!)**

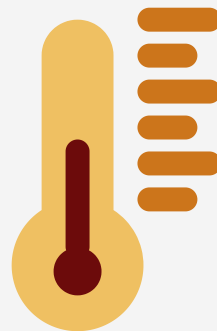
WHAT TO EXPECT



It's best to **dress in layers**. A quality jacket & pants with a high waterproof rating like Gore-Tex will be your best bet in any weather, along with a layer of lightweight long underwear and warm fleece underneath.



Quick drying fabrics are great for shirts and pants. There are many brands out there such as Columbia and Patagonia who offer these. Waterproof boots will be needed in the rain.



The weather is generally warmer during the day, but cools off significantly at night. Because of this, the temperature can range from 50 – 80°F (10 - 26°C). We generally run into some colder days early June and late August - September.

TACKLE & EQUIPMENT

You are welcome to bring your personal gear along for your trip. We do have excellent quality fishing rod rentals available at the lodge. Rod/Reel rentals are \$100 for a 4 day trip. Please indicate you require rental gear prior to your trip on your guest information form under “Gear Rental”. Or simply send us an email.

ROD

What can we say? You’re coming here for the big ones. That’s why we recommend a 6.5’ medium/heavy action rod, spooled with 20 – 30 lb line for both Pike and Lake Trout. We also suggest having heavy-duty leaders (at least 12” in length), as they are a must for the “Toothy Pike”. These are available at our tackle shop.

Jigging for Walleye or casting for Arctic Grayling can be done with a 6’ light/medium action rod, spooled with 6-8 lb line.

For Fly Fishermen, an 8-10 weight rod for Pike and Lake trout will do the trick, while a 4 weight will do fine for Arctic Grayling.

LURES

When fishing for Northern Pike and Lake Trout, the right lure can be the difference between a good day of fishing and an **unforgettable** day (because let’s face it, no day of fishing is a bad day). Every lure varies depending on the time of season and we will always suggest listening to the locals, guides, and professional anglers when it comes to choosing lures that have been successful for them on our lake. We have a list of personal favourite pike and trout lures that we have compiled in a few easy blog post for you, all with suggestions from our experienced guides and avid anglers of Reindeer Lake.

For Arctic Grayling, even a light spinning rod with a dry fly is successful in capturing the trophies. Small hoppers, woolly buggers, deer or elk hair caddis are all great options and available at the lodge. We also suggest a 00 or 01 mepps spinner as a killer lure for these beautiful sailfish. These aren't huge fish, so you don't need to have a heavy rod, and you most certainly don't need a heavy lure.

For Walleye, some of the best lures are crankbaits and jigs with soft plastics like curl tail grubs or ring worms. For the crankbait, the best are the ones that sink down to at least 10ft, as that is the typical depth for Walleye. They are mainly used for trolling along flats and reefs, while most soft plastics are used in rivers to gain the attention of walleye in the challenges of moving water. The gear and tackle you bring may be dependent on time of year and your fish of choice, so if you have any questions call us...we love to talk fishing!

Reindeer Lake is a catch and release lake, meaning the use of barbless hooks are mandatory. Please pinch your barbs with pliers or your guide can do so for you.



DEPARTURE HOME FROM THE LODGE

Breakfast will be served at 7 a.m. We ask for you to be packed and checked out of your cabin by this time so we can prepare it for the next group of guests. Our staff will transport your luggage to the dock. We depart for the airstrip around 8 a.m. - we'll keep you posted on the charters arrival.

WHEN YOU ARRIVE BACK IN SASKATOON

You will be dropped off at the main airport Terminal rather than the RiseAir Hangar since most guests have a connecting flight in the afternoon which departs from the main terminal.

FORGOT TO BRING SOMETHING?

If you happen to forget anything or couldn't fit it in your luggage due to weight restrictions, don't worry, we have everything you could need at the Lodge. There is a tackle shop with a wide selection of our best lures and rental setups and a clothing store just in case you need some warm clothing or a souvenir to bring home. We also carry confectionary items and hygienic items at our store and a fully stocked bar for your drink of choice. You'll be treated like family at Arctic Lodges! We want you to be comfortable and feel as though you claimed a piece of paradise to call your own.
